## **General Information:**

**Safety Inspections:** All those wishing to participate in the battles (**this includes all the Native Americans as well**), are to be inspected. Inspections are mandatory for all the participants that are firing any type of firearm. This year (2009) will be held in the appropriate camps at 9:00 AM on Saturday and 10:00 AM on Sunday. Dan Lima will be conducting the inspection for the Natives in the Village, Bill Protz will see to the French in the French Camp and Brian Wilson will see to the British in the British Camp. There are not to be any inspections made on the Battlefield. Your Firearms, Cartridges, bags and other weapons are to be inspected. Bring your cartridges to the color ceremonies, you must be prepared!! **MUST HAVE FLASH GUARD AND FRIZEN STALL!!!** The only exception will be for the mounted troops when they are mounted on horse back.  
**Parking-** all participants are to park in the grass lanes in the fields east of the camp areas. Park close to the vehicle next to you, so we can get everyone parked. Also, always park to the right. **NEVER PARK IN PUBLIC PARKING AREAS**  
**Musicians-** We would like all Musicians to assist in the opening and closing ceremonies. The music will be "Le Drapau", "God Save the King", "Chester", "Hail Columbia", "Star Spangled Banner" and "Parting Glass"  
**Breakfast-** is available each morning for a minimal cost.

**Food-** will be available for purchase Saturday and Sunday. **THERE WILL BE SOME FOOD VENDORS THAT WILL BE OPENING FOR SCHOOL DAY.**

**Ice -** Ice will be available throughout the weekend at the Root Beer stand. After hours ice and beverages are on the honor system at the Root Beer stand.

**Saturday Evening Meal-** as usual will be provided and served at 6:00 PM. Bring your own dinner ware, eating utensils and drinks. Prize drawings will follow the dinner. This will be in the amphitheatre.

**First Aid-** EMT's will be available 24 hours, during the day by Ambulance and will be on call during the evenings.

**Battles:** This year we will be having 3 Battles and a tactical demonstration. The two battles will be modeled after the 1759 siege of Fort Niagara. The other Battle will be a battle of opportunity. Please remember though, that the public still needs to be entertained, we must keep this in mind. The tactical demonstration will be held on the parade field. This will be using linear open field tactics. Note: that the evening battle on Saturday may be switched to the battle on Sunday if needed.

**Provost-** Our provost, Kevin Walden, is unable to attend this year. Our inspections are the responsibility of Dan Lima, Bill Protz and Brian Wilson.

**Parade Field-** is available for drilling or other unit activities. Please let Brian Wilson know your intentions. Please check the military schedule.

**Parades-** We will march to the parade field for Opening & Closing Colors each day

**Lost and Found-** If you have found or lost an item , please go to the cabin.

**Video-** There is a video of last year's event available at the cabin for a small fee.

**Check In – Everyone must stop by the cabin and check in by signing a waiver.**

**Powder Horns-** are not to be used to load from on the battlefield.

**Woods Tactical:** This year there will be **no woods** tactical prior to the first battle on Saturday.

**Fire pits: Please remember to put your camp back as you found it. Please put the sod from your fire pit back as it was. Also please put any unused firewood back on the wood pile. No Straw (broken bales) or rocks (for fire pits) will be allowed in the camp areas in the Hay Field.**
